The first meeting of the Legion of Mary took place in Myra House, Francis Street, Dublin, Ireland, on 7 September, 1921. The Legion continue to do great work in our parish, most notably their work with the people who use the services of Regina Coeli and Morning Star Hostels. We wish them well for the next 100 years!
